Daisy E. Hepler of LaPorte, formerly of rural Hamlet, passed away on Wednesday, November 29, 2023 at Brickyard Health, Knox following an illness. She was born on October 6, 1930 in Leetonia, OH to the late John N. and Hope (Shafer) Stayton and was 93 years-old at the time of her death.
