



## Daniel J. Fortlander

August 27, 1956 - June 10, 2017

WALKERTON-Daniel James Fortlander, 60, passed away at his home on Saturday, June 10, 2017 after a sudden illness.

Mr. Fortlander was born August 27, 1956 in Maumee, OH to Frederick and Marcia (Collins) Fortlander and lived in the area for 14 years, coming from South Bend.

On March 18, 1995 in South Bend, IN, he was married to the former Lori Wood, who survives. Also surviving are two daughters, Shelby Fortlander and Mikayla Fortlander, both of Walkerton; one son, Caleb Fortlander of Walkerton; his parents, Fred and Marcia Fortlander of South Bend; two brothers, Ken (Jennifer) Fortlander of South Bend and Ron (Karen) Fortlander of Portland, OR; three nieces, Janessa Burns and Katie and Emily Fortlander; and one nephew, Kyle Fortlander.

Mr. Fortlander was a beloved Band Director at John Glenn High School for 32 years. He graduated from Ball State University in 1978 with a Bachelor of Music Degree. He was a member of the Phi Mu Alpha Fraternity and the American Music Association.

Funeral services will be Friday, June 16, 2017 at 3:00 p.m. Eastern Time at John Glenn High School with Pastor James Miller officiating. Friends may visit on Thursday at John Glenn High School from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Seating for the service on Friday at the high school will take place one hour before the service. In lieu of flowers, memorial contributions may be given in Mr.
