June 6, 1925 - May 2, 2020

Argos – Dean C. Holderread, age 94, passed away on Saturday, May 2 at the Catherine Kasper Life Center in Donaldson following an illness. He was born on June 6, 1925 in Mishawaka to John and Delcie (Lemert) Holderread, both who precede his death.

He lived in Argos for 32 years coming from Donaldson and was a retired meat cutter at the former G & G Supermarket in Plymouth. In 1946 in North Liberty he married Delores Reed, who also preceded him in death. In 1985 he married Agnes (Logan) Bradley, who also preceded him in death. He was a veteran of the US Navy having served in WWII, was the former Pastor at Trinity Tabernacle Church in Donaldson, was the former owner of Dean's Print Shop in Plymouth, and formerly attended the Highway Chapel Church of God in Hamlet.
