HAMLET-Earl F. Wringer, 91, passed away June 9, 2011 in Millers Merry Manor, Culver, IN. Mr. Wringer was born July 28, 1919 in LaPorte County, IN to Forrest and Nellie (Norvell) Wringer and lived in the area all of his life. On October 18, 1941 at Koontz Lake, IN he was married to the former Freda Fisher. Survivors include his wife, Freda; two sons, Donald (Barb) Wringer of Hamlet and Larry Wringer of Benton Harbor, MI; one daughter, Sharon (Mike) Singleton of Knox; nine grandchildren; fourteen great-grandchildren; two great-great grandchildren; one brother, Clifton (Dorothy) Wringer of Walkerton; one sister, Lydia Bartley of South Bend and many nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents and one brother, James Wringer.

Mr. Wringer was a former self-employed construction worker. He was a veteran of the U.S. Army, serving in WWII until becoming disabled during the Battle of the Bulge. He was a member of the Hamlet American Legion and the Disabled Veterans of America. He attended the Hamlet United Methodist Church and was very active in 4-H Horse and Pony, serving as a leader and barn manager.
