Elvin Earl White, 83, passed away January 6, 2016 in St. Joseph Hospital, Plymouth, IN.

Elvin was born December 6, 1932 in Beltrami County, MN to Alfred and Florence (Anderson) White. He was a plumber-pipefitter with O.J. Shoemaker of South Bend and a member of the Plumbers & Pipefitters Union #172 of South Bend.
