Lynn L. Stull, 76, passed away at his home on Sunday, August 20, 2017 after a sudden illness.

Lynn was born September 20, 1940 in LaPorte, IN to Dale and Vada (Smith) Stull and lived in the area all of his life.

On September 18, 1959 in Walkerton, IN, he was married to the former Myrna Holsinger, who survives. Also surviving are their children, Tammy (Haze) Pulluaim, Tom (Connie) Stull, Ted (Kim) Stull and David (Tori) Stull; 13 grandchildren; nine great-grandchildren; one sister, Carol Foster; and one brother, Rex Stull. He was preceded in death by his parents.

Lynn was retired from Deluxe Sheet Metal, South Bend, where he worked for 26 years. He was a 1958 graduate of Tyner High School and was committed to the Polk Township and Tyner community. Lynn was a former John Glenn School Board member for 12 years, a life-time member of the IOOF Lodge #821 of Tyner and he was the Polk Township Trustee and former advisory board member. Lynn was a member of the Blissville Church of the Brethren, serving as a deacon of the church. He was a Little League Baseball coach when his sons played and enjoyed watching his grandchildren's games and activities. Lynn grew up on the family farm and continued farming during his lifetime. He was an avid Cubs fan and was very happy to witness the Cubs' World Series Championship. He also enjoyed his weekly golf and card games with his buddies.

Funeral services will be Thursday, August 24, 2017 at 11:00 a.m. EDT at the

Blissville Church of the Brethren. Burial will follow at the Woodlawn Cemetery, Walkerton.
