HAMLET- Neil D. Berg passed away on Thursday, January 20, 2022 in Northwest Health, LaPorte Hospital following an illness. He was born on January 27, 1956 in Knox to the late Robert F. and Rubie R. (Koch) Berg and was 65 years-old at the time of his death.

Neil lived in the area his entire life and previously worked doing auto body repair for Lawmaster Pontiac in Plymouth. He was a Veteran of the US Navy where he proudly served as a SEAL Team Member. He also was a member of both the Hamlet American Legion Post 356 (serving many roles including past Commander) and the Knox VFW Post 748.
