Scott Clark passed away at Lutheran Hospital on September 16, 2023, surrounded by his family. He was born in South Bend, Indiana on September 22, 1961, and was raised in Koontz Lake. He graduated from Oregon-Davis in the class of 1980 and stayed in this area his whole life.

He married Christy (Rausch) on June 7th, 1986, celebrating 37 years together this summer. Together, they built the home and the farm they loved and raised four wonderful children. He loved to travel, and his career ensured he did just that. He started hauling Christmas trees and hay while he was in high school. He continued the family business and later began hauling freight across the country. He enjoyed taking his children along with him on road trips. He loved to be able to visit and teach them the “proper way” of traveling – you better not use a GPS! When he was no longer able to continue driving, it was probably one of the saddest moments in his life.

Most of his life he enjoyed working with his mules and spending time out in his barn. He acquired many dear friends going to mule sales and auctions. One of his favorite things to do was to visit, either in person or on the phone. He could spend hours talking with people. It didn't matter if he had just met you, he would carry on a conversation. He was witty and had a great sense of humor. No one could compete with his quick remarks and quirky one-liners. Whenever you were around Scott, you were typically laughing. He loved to make sure everyone was having a good time.

He is survived by his wife, Christy, three children, Hannah (Bill) Norris, Jonathan and Chloe Clark, his mother, Carol (Ben) Clark-Finley, two sisters, Kim (Ben) Baker and Beth (Keith) Fraine and many nieces and nephews whom he loved. He is preceded in death by his father James “Jim” Clark and his son, Henry Clark.
