KOONTZ LAKE – Stanley Vincent Madison passed away on Wednesday, July 21, 2021 at the University of Michigan Health West Hospital in Wyoming, MI following an illness. He was born on January 18, 1941 in Detroit, MI to the late Vincent and Mary Jane (Swinton) Madison and was 80 years-old at the time of his death.
